## BIOGRAPHIES

高虹 Gao Hong, a renowned Chinesepipa player, composer, improviser and educator graduated from the Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing where she studied with pipa master Lin Shicheng. She has received numerous awards and honors at homeand abroad. In 2005, Gao Hong became the first traditional musician to be awarded the prestigious Bush Artist Fellowship, and in 2019 she became the only musician in any genre to win five McKnight Artist Fellowships for Performing Musicians. She has also been awarded Gold Medals by the Global Music Awards for her CDs and compositions. In 2018, she was awarded a Sally Award from the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts. She has received numerous commissions and has performed countless U.S. and world premieres of pipa concerti with organizations such as the Minnesota Orchestra, Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Heidelberg Philharmonic, Buenos Aires Philharmonic, South Netherlands Philharmonic, China National Orchestra, and many others. In 2016, Gao Hong completed the first pipa method book ever written in English and had it published by Hal Leonard.

She is Guest Professor at the Central Conservatory of Music and China Conservatory of Music in Beijing, and the Tianjing Conservatory of Music. In 2022, Mayor Melvin Carter of St. Paul proclaimed April 3, 2022 to be "Gao Hong Day in the City of St. Paul" in honor of Gao Hong's milestone concert at the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts - "50 YEARS OF MAKING MUSIC WITH FRIENDS". She is a board member for the American Composers Forum and Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, and is a Recording Academy Voting Member for the Grammys, a Governor to the Board and Songwriters & Composers Wing Committee Co-Chair for the Recording Academy's Chicago/Midwest Chapter. The **Carleton Chinese Music Ensemble**, under the direction of Gao Hong, was recently featured nationwide on American Public Media's Performance Today - America's most popular classical music radio program, hosted by Fred Child. The ensemble members were hired for the Minnesota Orchestra's pre-concert performances in Peavey Plaza in Minneapolis, receiving high praise from the audience and Minnesota Orchestra patrons. In August and September of 2023, the ensemble, along with CAAM Chinese Dance Theater, represented China at two prestigious UNESCO-sponsored festivalsin Zaragoza and Ronda, Spain.

Established in 2005, the Carleton Chinese Music Ensemble has garnered acclaim through performances at various venues, including the ASIA Network 22nd Annual Conference in Chicago, Minnesota Orchestra pre-concerts, Winona State University's International Music Series, University of Wisconsin-River Falls, the Ordway Concert Hall, and the Ordway's Flint Hills International Children's Festival. They have also been featured at the National Conference for Silk Road Scholars at the University of Minnesota, the Schubert Club, Harmony of Mayo Concert Series, Westminster Concert Series and Town Hall Forum (Live Streaming at MPR), Land O'Lakes Company's Celebrate Asian Pacific American Heritage Month Concert Series, Minneapolis Institute of Arts, Mall of America, University of Minnesota, Confucius Institute's China Day 2010 event at Northrop Auditorium, Organization of Chinese Americans' annual Chinese New Year Celebration, and at the Chinese Minghua Language School in St. Paul.

In Northfield, they performed the inaugural concert for Northfield Library's Carnegie Concert Series, at the Alliance to Advance Liberal Arts Colleges (AALAC) 2019 National Conference, at St. Olaf College, Northfield High School and Middle School, and at Carleton's international festivals, gallery openings, and Chinese New Year celebrations. They were even featured on a KSTP Channel 5 News broadcast. In May of 2023, the Carleton Chinese Music Ensemble was showcased at a Carleton Honors Convocation. In 2015, the Carleton Chinese Music Ensemble and the Global Music Ensemble released their first CD – "Music from China and Beyond," featuring their performances from 2005-2015.
